

HOME LEARNING

In school we have thought of lots of different ways that we can make 10 (examples below) can you use items from around your home or natural materials to make collections of 10?


Can you talk about what you have collected? For example "There are seven cars and three dinosaurs which make ten toys altogether".

This week we have continued our learning through the theme of Fantastical Tales with the wonderful book 'The Kiss that Missed' by David Melling. One evening, when the King is in a hurry, his goodnight kiss to the Little Prince goes astray. After rattling around the Prince's bedroom, it flies out the window and floats into the dark forest! The King orders his Knight to climb on his horse, ride into the forest, and bring back the kiss. However, the forest is filled with spooky things that frighten both the Knight and his horse. How will they ever succeed in bringing the kiss back to the castle?



The children have really enjoyed sharing their ideas about how the Knight could capture the missing kiss and when we stopped just before the end (shock) we thought about the different ways that the story may end. Thankfully, they didn't all get eaten by the dragon and there was a happy ever after.

Next week, the children will use some of the ideas from this story to create their own adventure about a time that something went missing!

In Maths this week we have been 'digging deeper' into the number 10! We have looked at the different numbers (bonds) that make 10 using the part, part whole models and 10s frames.
