If your child is in reception:

If your child is in nursery:

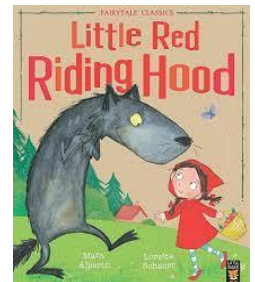
Can you build in time this week to share a story with your child. Sharing stories is a great way to help expand your child's language...but there is more to it than just reading.

Talk about what you can see, ask questions and see if your child can retell the story to you.

It doesn't matter if they tell it differently or make up their own version, what's important is that they're expanding their vocabulary by talking about the book and also practising forming sentences in the past tense

Dear Parents & Carers

Our story this week has been the traditional tale of Little Red Riding Hood. When Little Red Riding Hood arrives at Grandmas cottage, there is someone BIG, HAIRY and very, very SCARY waiting in Granny's bed... Will Little Red Riding Hood be breakfast for that big, bad wolf?



This week we have shared and retold the story using puppets and story mapping. The children thought about words to describe the wolf in the story – he is big, hairy, scary, cunning and fast!

We have enjoyed getting creative this week using paint and black paper to create beautiful firework pictures. The children learnt a little about Bonfire night and shared some of their experiences of watching fireworks at the weekend.

This week we thought about people who sacrifice to help others. The children watched a short animation and shared their thoughts about the importance of helping others in need. We looked at the different parts of the remembrance poppy and what they represented and enjoyed making our own poppies to help us remember the soldiers who sacrificed to help those in need.
