Reception children:

Nursery children:

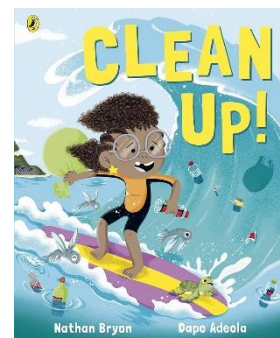
Can you go on a sound treasure hunt this week? A sound treasure hunt is a fantastic way of having fun with your child and helping their early reading skills.

Ask your child to find objects around the house that begin with a certain letter sound and see how many they can find. You can also play this game when you're out and about.

This activity is great for developing your child's understanding that words are made up of lots of different letter sounds, which is an important skill to have when learning to read and write.

Our story this week has been 'Clean Up' By Nathan Bryon. In this thoughtful story we join Rocket as she sets sail on a mission – to save a Caribbean beach from plastic pollution! When Rocket goes on holiday to visit her grandparents, she is shocked by the pollution that's spoiling their island home and putting the local sea life at risk. Can she think of a way to save the day and bring the community together?



This week we have continued to think about the people who help us by learning about people who help in our wider community. The children learnt about the recycling lorries that collect our rubbish and thought about where the rubbish goes. We enjoyed thinking about the different ways that rubbish can avoid landfill by being reused and recycled.

In maths this week, we have been exploring the different ways to make 6. The children are getting super speedy at recognising a group of 6 things without counting.

This week we were delighted to use our forest school area for the first time. The children had time to explore mud painting and making bird feeders, we agreed this was a great way to reuse old plastic pots!
