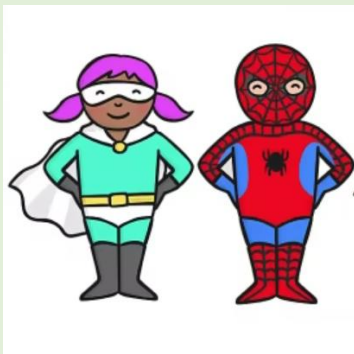


#### HOME LEARNING

Will you have a cape? A mask? What colours will you choose?

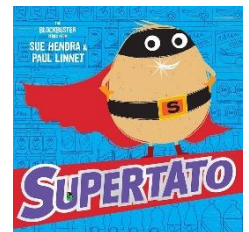
We cannot wait to see your designs.
